CITY OF ST. LOUIS COMMUNICATIONS LICENSE (Low Voltage license)

Required for cable TV installers/installation contractors and cable/telecommunications construction contractors

A Communications License is required whenever inside television cable wiring or campus-type cable or telecommunications wiring is involved. It is also required when telecommunications or cable facilities are built in the City rights-of-way. At least one member of the contracting firm must complete the test. (At least one employee of the cable franchise grantee must also complete the test.) If the employee holding the license leaves the firm, another person must test for the license.

Communications License test is given on the Second Tuesday of each month in Room 425 City Hall. Application should be made no later than *one week in advance*. Application must be notarized.

Communications test is based upon Chapter 8 of the National Electric Code. Test is graded by the Board of Electrical Examiners at its regular meeting.

If the person who takes the test fails, they cannot re-test for 90 days. Someone else from the same company may take the test.

In addition to the Communications License, all installation and construction contractors working in the public right-of-way must have a *City Business License*, as must the cable franchise grantee. (For business license, apply at Collector of Revenue, Room 106, City Hall.)
