Are You Recycling Everything That Can Be Recycled?

Commingled Containers

Empty and rinse containers. Remove non-recyclable caps and lids.

Aluminum



- bottles and cans
- foil
- food trays
- pie plates

Aseptic



- boxes
 - packs
 - pouches
- (e.g., that contained juice, soy milk, broth, stock)

Gable Top



- cartons
- (e.g., that contained juice, milk, dry goods, candy)

Glass



- brown, clear, and green bottles and jars

Plastic



- Plastics marked with a #1, 2, 3, 4, 5, or 7 that contained:
- beverages
 - food
 - body care products
 - household products
 - other non-hazardous products



Steel



- Bottles and cans that contained:
- food (e.g., fruit, soup, vegetables)
 - drinks (e.g., juice)
 - aerosols (e.g., air freshener, deodorant)



Materials Accepted For Recycling

Are You Recycling Everything That Can Be Recycled?

Papers

Must be clean and dry. No food contaminated materials.

Catalogs / Magazines / Mixed Paper / Newspaper

- mail
- stationery
- white paper
- packing paper
- gift wrap (no foil type)
- folders without metal or plastic
- colored, copier, and printer paper
- envelopes (including plastic windows)



- thin catalogs
- glossy or slick paper
- advertising flyers
- paper inserts
- telephone books
- paperback books



Cardboard

FLATTEN CARDBOARD. Must be clean and dry. No food contaminated materials.

Chipboard / Paperboard / Carrier Stock

Corrugated Cardboard



Boxes that contained:

- beer
- dry foods
- paper supplies
- shoes
- soda



- brown / Kraft paper bags and wrapping paper
- boxes



Materials NOT Accepted For Recycling

- plastic bags
- plastic film or wrap
- plastic #6 / Styrofoam / polystyrene
- non-container plastics (e.g., furniture, hangers, toys)
- non-container metals (e.g., scrap metal, furniture, hangers)
- other glass (e.g., colors other than brown, clear, or green; ceramics; dishware; light bulbs; mirrors; Pyrex; windows)
- other paper (e.g., egg cartons; food or beverage trays/carriers; facial, sanitary, or toilet tissue; hardback books; thermal or treated, carbon, construction, or tissue paper)
- binders, binder clips, decorations (e.g., bows, ribbons, string, twine), rubberbands
- wax, plastic, or foil coated or lined materials
- containers that held hazardous materials
- fiber drums (e.g., oatmeal canisters)
