

ORDINANCE #65591
Board Bill No. 146

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service to vacate public surface rights for vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel on the most western 147 feet ± 6 feet of the 10 foot wide east/west alley in City Block 5415 as bounded by Pershing Avenue, Des Peres Avenue, Forest Park Parkway, and Skinker Boulevard in the City of St. Louis, Missouri, as hereinafter described, in accordance with Charter authority, and in conformity with Section 14 of Article XXI of the Charter and imposing certain conditions on such vacation.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE: The public surface rights of vehicle, equestrian and pedestrian travel, between the rights-of-way of:

A tract of land being part of a 10 foot wide alley, lying south of and adjacent to City Block 5415 of the City of St. Louis, Missouri; said being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the east right-of-way line of Skinker Boulevard, formerly Skinker Road, 100 feet wide, and the south right-of-way line of Pershing Avenue, formerly Berlin Avenue, 60 feet wide, said intersection also being the northwest corner of said City Block 5415, from which a found "+" cut in the concrete walk bears north 89 degrees 51 minutes 49 seconds west, a distance of 5.00 feet; thence along said east right-of-way line, south 00 degrees 23 minutes 11 seconds west, a distance of 121.28 feet to the intersection of said east right-of-way line and the north right-of-way line of said alley, 10.00 feet wide, from which a found "+" cut in the concrete walk bears north 89 degrees 51 minutes 49 seconds west, a distance of 5.00 feet, said intersection also being the point of beginning of the tract herein described; thence along said south line of City Block 5415, south 89 degrees 51 minutes 49 seconds east, a distance of 141.12 feet; thence leaving said south line, 15.50 feet along the arc of a curve to the left, having a radius of 41.00 feet, through a central angle of 21 degrees 39 minutes 16 seconds, with a chord that bears south 49 degrees 22 minutes 55 seconds west, a distance of 15.40 feet to the north right-of-way of Forest Park Parkway; thence along said north right-of-way, north 89 degrees 51 minutes 49 seconds west, a distance of 152.88 feet to the intersection of said north right-of-way line and said east right-of-way line of Skinker Boulevard; thence along said east right-of-way line, north 00 degrees 23 minutes 11 seconds east, a distance of 10.00 feet to the point of beginning, containing 0.03 acres (1,460 square feet).

are, upon the conditions hereinafter set out, vacated.

SECTION TWO: Washington University plans to use vacated area to provide a sidewalk/landscape for a proposed office/retail development. Petitioner will be required to construct a new 15 foot wide north/south alley as approved by the Board of Public Service and to dedicate same.

SECTION THREE: All rights of the public in the land bearing rights-of-way traversed by the foregoing conditionally vacated alley, are reserved to the City of St. Louis for the public including present and future uses of utilities, governmental service entities and franchise holders, except such rights as are specifically abandoned or released herein.

SECTION FOUR: The owners of the land may, at their election and expense remove the surface pavement of said so vacated alley provided however, all utilities within the rights-of-way shall not be disturbed or impaired and such work shall be accomplished upon proper City permits.

SECTION FIVE: The City, utilities, governmental service entities and franchise holders shall have the right and access to go upon the land and occupation hereof within the rights-of-way for purposes associated with the maintenance, construction or planning of existing or future facilities, being careful not to disrupt or disturb the owners interests more than is reasonably required.

SECTION SIX: The owners shall not place any improvement upon, over or in the land traversed by the rights-of-way

without a lawful permit from the City and written consent of the utilities, governmental service entities and franchise holders, present or future; and such consent together with the terms and conditions thereof shall be filed in writing with the Board of Public Service and approved by such Board prior to the undertaking of any such construction concerning the rights-of-way.

SECTION SEVEN: The owners may secure the removal of all or any part of the facilities of a utility, governmental service entity or franchise holder by agreement in writing with such utilities, governmental entity or franchise holder, filed with the Board of Public Service prior to the undertaking of such removal.

SECTION EIGHT: In the event that granite curbing or cobblestones are removed within the vacated area, the Department of Streets of the City of St. Louis must be notified and it in turn will remove said curbing or cobblestones at the current removal price.

SECTION NINE: This ordinance shall be ineffective unless within sixty (60) days after its approval, or such longer time as is fixed by the Board of Public Service not to exceed one hundred twenty (120) days from approval or override, the owners of the land subservient to the rights-of-way concerned shall deposit a sum with the Comptroller of the City of St. Louis for the use and benefit of the City Water Division estimated by said Division to be sufficient to cover the full expense of removal and relocation of Water facilities, if any; further, such owner or owners shall within said time deposit an additional sum of money with the Comptroller of the City of St. Louis for the use and benefit of the City Traffic and Transportation Division estimated by said Division to be sufficient to cover the full expense of removal of all lighting facilities, if any; upon such deposit being made to the benefit of the Water Division and the Traffic and Transportation Division, they shall proceed as is reasonably expedient to accomplish all work required and all useful access and occupation shall be accorded, further, such owner or owners shall within said time, deposit an additional sum with the Comptroller of the City of St. Louis estimated by the said Board as sufficient to defray the expenses required for the adjustment of the City's streets including curbs, sidewalks, driveways, roadway drainage connections and inlets, grading, paving sidewalks and roadways and road signage; provided further that said owners shall, under direction of the Director of Streets of the City of St. Louis, accomplish the aforesaid adjustments, at their own expense, but in the event said owners fail to accomplish such within allowable time, according to the direction of the Director, the Director shall cause the same to be performed and upon his certification of expenses, the Comptroller shall appropriate said deposit, or so much thereof as required to defray such expenses to the City or others; no claims or demands whatever arising out of such vacation or adjustment shall be made or prosecuted by owners, their heirs, successors or assigns; and the Comptroller after determining the total cost of the foregoing to the City shall return any unexpended part of said deposits to the owner or owners.

SECTION TEN: An affidavit stating that all of the conditions of this ordinance have been/will be fulfilled and/or complied with must be submitted to the Board of Public Service for acceptance fourteen (14) months from the date of the signing and approval of this ordinance. If this affidavit is not submitted within the prescribed time the ordinance will be null and void.
