

ORDINANCE #66022
Board Bill No. 204

An Ordinance authorizing and directing the Commissioner of Emergency Management, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute a Grant Agreement with the State of Missouri Emergency Management Agency for a grant to fund State Homeland Security Program, Part 2, appropriating said funds in the amount of \$500,000.00, and authorizing the Commissioner of Emergency Management, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the funds by entering into contracts or otherwise for grant purposes and containing an emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. The Commissioner of Emergency Management is hereby authorized and directed, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute a Grant Agreement with the State of Missouri Emergency Management Agency to fund the State Homeland Security Grant Program, Part 2. Said Grant Agreement shall be substantially in words and figures the same as the attached Agreement, which is made part of this Ordinance and is on file in the Register's Office.

SECTION TWO. The Commissioner of Emergency Management is hereby authorized and directed, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the funds, which are hereby appropriated for said purpose, by entering into contracts or otherwise received pursuant to the Grant Agreement, totaling \$500,000.00, in a manner that is consistent with the provisions of said Agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall become part of the ordinance.

SECTION 3. Emergency Clause. This being an Ordinance for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, it is hereby declared to be an immediate measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
