

1 BOARD BILL NO. 82 INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN FREEMAN BOSLEY, SR

2 An ordinance recommended by the Parking Commission making appropriation  
3 for payment of the operating expenses, capital equipment and improvement expenses,  
4 including lease purchase agreements involving Parking Division assets, and debt service  
5 expenses of the Parking Division of the Treasurer's Office, Kiel Parking Facilities,  
6 Argyle Parking Facility, Chouteau Parking Facility, Williams Paper Parking Facility, and  
7 the Central Downtown Parking Facility for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008 and  
8 ending June 30, 2009, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Twelve Million, Five  
9 Hundred Twenty Nine Thousand, Nine Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$12,529,990) and  
10 containing an emergency clause.

11 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

12 SECTION ONE. There is hereby appropriated, from the anticipated revenue of  
13 the Parking Fund, the Sum of Six Million, Nine Hundred Eighty Thousand, Five Hundred  
14 Sixty Eight Dollars (\$6,980,568) for the payment during the fiscal period beginning July  
15 1, 2008 and extending through June 30, 2009 of operating expenses, capital expenses,  
16 lease/purchase agreements for Parking Division assets, including parking systems and  
17 equipment and other required expenses of the Parking Division of the Treasurer's Office,  
18 as hereinafter detailed on Exhibit 1.

19 SECTION TWO. Pursuant to Ordinance 62674, dated July 7, 1992, there is  
20 hereby appropriated from revenues available to the Kiel Center Parking Facilities the sum  
21 of Two Million, Eight Hundred Four Thousand, Five Hundred Twelve Dollars  
22 (\$2,804,512) for the operations and maintenance of the Kiel Center Parking Facilities,  
23 including the sum of One Million, Nine Hundred Ninety Eight Thousand, Six Hundred  
24 Fifty Dollars (\$1,998,650) for debt service as hereinafter detailed on Exhibit 2.

25 SECTION THREE. Pursuant to Ordinance 64539 dated January 4, 1999, there is  
26 hereby appropriated from revenues available to the Argyle Parking Facility the sum of  
27 Five Hundred Ninety Nine Thousand, Nine Hundred Ninety Five Dollars (\$599,995) for

1 the operations and maintenance of the Argyle Parking Facility, including the sum of Two  
2 Hundred Twenty Eight Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$228,200) for debt service as  
3 hereinafter detailed on Exhibit 3.

4 SECTION FOUR. There is hereby appropriated from revenues available to the  
5 Chouteau Parking Facility the sum of Three Hundred Fifty Five Thousand Dollars  
6 (\$355,000) for the operations and maintenance of the Chouteau Parking Facility as  
7 hereinafter detailed on Exhibit 4.

8 SECTION FIVE. There is hereby appropriated from revenues available to The  
9 Williams Paper Parking Facility the sum of One Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars  
10 (\$110,000) for the operations and maintenance of The Williams Paper Parking Facility as  
11 hereinafter detailed in Exhibit 5.

12 SECTION SIX. Pursuant to ordinance 65403 dated January 25, 2002, there is  
13 hereby appropriated from revenues available to the Central Downtown Parking Facility  
14 the sum of One Million, Four Hundred Sixty Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Fifteen  
15 Dollars (\$1,469,915) for the operations and maintenance of the Central Downtown  
16 Parking Facility including the sum of Nine Hundred Seventy Nine Thousand One  
17 Hundred Dollars (\$979,100) for debt service as hereinafter detailed on Exhibit 6.

18 SECTION SEVEN. Pursuant to Ordinance 67255 dated October 17, 2006, there  
19 is hereby appropriated from revenues available to the Buckingham Parking Facility the  
20 sum of Two Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$210,000) for the operations and  
21 maintenance of the Buckingham Parking Facility including the sum of One Hundred  
22 Eighty Three Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$183,200) for debt service as hereinafter  
23 detailed on Exhibit 7.

24 SECTION EIGHT. The passage of this Ordinance being deemed necessary for  
25 the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, it is hereby declared to  
26 be an emergency Ordinance as provided for by Article IV. Section 20 of the Charter of  
27 the City of St. Louis and shall be effective immediately upon approval by the Mayor.
